The National and Commercial Space Programs Act of 2010

- Secretary of Commerce to license
 - Delegated to NOAA's Commercial Remote Sensing Regulatory Affairs (CRSRA)
- Need a license to operate a private remote sensing system in the U. S.
 - Private = Non-U.S. Government
 - Capable of actively or passively sensing the Earth

- Complete application and send for review
 - Do-loop review with CRSRA
 - Submit final...paper and e-copy

License General Conditions

- Preserve national security and observe foreign policy/international obligations
- Operational control from within the US
- Limit collection/dissemination as required
- Notify NOAA of foreign agreements
- Report deviations & anomalies (even planned)
- Data available to the national archive
- Disposal plan
- Data Protection Plan...approved prior to launch



Compliance and Monitoring

- Launch plans/prelaunch documentation
- Audits
 - Baseline by all new applicants
 - Annual by all licensees
 - Quarterly after launch
- Annual on-site inspections
 - Mission Control Center
 - Ground stations
 - Bent Pipes
 - Downlink receive only




Licensing Activity

- Explosion of new licensees & licenses
 - 26 issued FY 96 to FY10
 - 46 issued FY10 to present
 - 11 applications in process
 - 22 other entities told they must apply
- Explosion of foreign and domestic Ground Station inspection sites
 - 26 sites at end of FY10
 - 93 current sites--71 locations
 - 10+ sites pending approval
 - 100+ sites anticipated by FY16
- 52 on-orbit satellites...6 on Oct 1, 2010...maybe 100+ on 1/1/2016
